save Impressionism

French anti-academic art movement of the late 19th century, gaining its name from a painting by <u>Monet</u> entitled *Impression, Sunrise* (1874). Impressionists aimed to create 'a spontaneous work rather than a calculated one'. In the 1860s, Monet, <u>Renoir</u>, Sisley and Frédéric Bazille explored the possibilities of painting outdoors, analysing and interpreting the effects of light on nature. The first impressionist exhibition took place in 1874. Although not accepted at first, Impressionism became influential from the late 1880s. <u>Degas</u> and <u>Pissarro</u> were prominent and <u>Cézanne</u> exhibited with them twice. <u>Manet</u> was influenced by and influenced Impressionism. Other Impressionists include Berthe Morisot and Mary <u>Cassatt</u>. <u>Rodin</u> has been called Impressionist because of his interest in the effects of light on sculpture. In music, the term Impressionism refers to a period lasting from roughly 1890 to 1930, and is usually applied to the work of Claude <u>Debussy</u>. It tends to be subtle and atmospheric rather than overtly emotional. Many composers were influenced by Debussy, including Maurice <u>Ravel</u> and Frederick <u>Delius</u>. *See also* <u>Romanticism</u>
