




Academic Center For Excellence (ACE)

College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

CLEP is the most widely accepted credit by examination program in the United States today, helping students of all ages earn college degrees faster by getting credit for what they already know.

- Tests offered: College Algebra,
 History, Spanish, Literature
- **Cost: \$93** to take the test, \$25 per hour to add to the transcript
- **Time Limit:** Most tests are approximately 90 minutes
